It is interesting to me that as we pray for God to bring strong steadfast, leaders into position, so often we then turn and fight against what those leaders are doing and how the Lord is leading them. We often act like spoiled children constantly trying to push the boundaries. Also worthy of mention is the large number of people who bounce from church to church taking with them their woundedness while loudly proclaiming in every place how the "church" has hurt them. I cannot tell you how many times someone has told me how the Lord moved them to a church and how they love it, only to hear a month later that they have moved again because the pastor said or did something with which they did not agree. How destructive such behavior is to the Body of Christ. It is like a kidney suddenly deciding to be a lung. It is better to remain, learn, grow and sow than to keep up this self-destructive trend which results in great malice and separation in the church. This does not mean that anyone should stay in an abusive situation, but we do need to look to the Lord and seek godly counsel before we just jump ship and put God's name on it. We need to grow up and trust God to lead through his leaders. After all what business does an army have telling its leaders what to do or how to do it?

Let's repent, pray for purity and strength to be deeply rooted where He has planted us and grow in God.
